The concert stars Ciarán Sheehan, who has played the role of *The Phantom of the Opera* on Broadway and in Toronto more than a thousand times. Special guests are Sarah Pfisterer, who performed the role of Christine on Broadway over one thousand times, and Gabriel Donohue, a multi-instrumentalist who has toured with the renowned Chieftans and other Irish music luminaries.

The program will include such timeless and beloved Broadway anthems as *Music of the Night, Time to Say Goodbye,* and *All I Ask of You.* Lovers of Irish favorites will be thrilled to hear *Danny Boy, When Irish Eyes are Smiling,* and *Fields of Athenry.*

Born in Dublin, Sheehan came to New York to pursue a career in the theater. From his critically acclaimed performances in the title role of *The Phantom*, he went on to make a huge impact in Frank McCourt's PBS hit, *The Irish ... and How They Got That Way.* His powerful voice and stage presence have been heralded as nothing short of astonishing.

Sheehan's heartbreaking rendition of *Danny Boy* at the nationally televised funeral Mass of John F. Kennedy, Jr., and his wife, Carolyn, at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York was profoundly moving. Recently, he was a soloist at the funeral of Beau Biden, son of Vice President Joe Biden.

Currently, Sheehan is performing throughout the country with Franc D'Ambrosio, Brent Barrett, and Marcus Lovett in *The Four Phantoms*,— a 90-minute celebration of the legendary work of the many composers and artists who have made Broadway an American art form. "We are incredibly thrilled to present *An Evening with The Phantom and Friends* on our stage in Warminster," said Joseph Lovecchio, music director and conductor of the 70-member orchestra.

"Bringing world-class musical performance to our community is the mission of The Warminster Symphony, and I believe this concert will entertain, enthrall, and perhaps tug at a few heartstrings."
